POMMES FARCIES AUX PLEUROTTES

APPLES STUFFED WITH OYESTER MUSHROOMS. 4 servings

4 large baking apples, preferably Cortland

1/2 lemon

3 tablespoons unsalted butter

2 Garlic cloves, finely chopped

1/2 pound oyster mushrooms or wild mushrooms, cut into 3/8 slices

Salt and freshly ground pepper

1/4 cup creme fraiche or heavy (whipping) cream

1/4 cup chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley

1/2 cup chicken stock, preferably homemade, or water

Heat the oven to 350F. Butter a small shallow baking dish just big enough to hold the apples.

Cut off the top of each apple about an eight of the way down. Using a grapefruit knife or melon baller, hallow out the apples leaving a thin but sturdy "cup". Rub and moisten the apple "cups" with the cut lemon to discourage browing, and set aside. Pick over the apple tops and insides. Discard skin and seeds. Chop any apple flesh.

In a large frying pan, melt the butter over moderate heat. Add the garlic and stir until fragrant, about a minute. Add the chopped apple and the mushrooms with salt and pepper. Toss them in the butter over moderately high heat until the mushrooms lose all their moisture, about 5 minutes. Press a piece of foil on top and cover the pan if the mushrooms look dry to start. Stir in the creme fraiche or cream and the parsley and simmer to evaporate most of the lquid. Taste for seasoning.

Sprinkle the apple "cups" with salt and pepper. Spoon the mushroom mixture into the apples, mounding it slightly. Arrange the apples in the prepared daking dish and pour the stock around them Bake, uncovered, in the preheated oven until tender when pierced with a nkife, 45 minutes to 1 hour, depending on the size and variety of the apples. If the apples begin to brown during cooking, cover tnem with foil. Serve hot.

These apples, stuffed with a blend of apple insides, garlic, parsley, cream and mushrooms, then baked until tender, are a bull's-eye. They could team up with Roasted Pheasant with Calvados and Cream, Chicken in Cider Vinegar Sauce, or a plain roast bird or pork shops. If you like grilled sausage, either a fresh pork variety or blood pudding, it's a love marriage. This recipe is easily halved to serve two.
